Guardian Print Centre takes industry lead



The Guardian Print Centre has been successful in achieving accredited certification to ISO14001:2004 the environmental Standard and OHSAS18001:2007 the health and safety Standard. This system is integrated with their existing ISO9001:2000 quality system.

This is an enormous achievement for a large organisation who produce 500,000 copies of a newspaper between 8pm and 4am each night and is a first for the newspaper industry. We are grateful to Brett Lawrence, the General Manager of Guardian Print Centre, who publicly thanked Penarth Management in a press release earlier this year.

Look out for ISO9001:2008



ISO 9001:2000 was published late in 2000. A revised Standard has been evolving and it is expected that ISO 9001:2008 will be available towards the end of this year.

The changes are relatively few, but we will be on hand to make the changes needed to comply with the new requirements. This will have to be done within twelve months.

Corporate Manslaughter -

The Corporate Manslaughter and Corporate Homicide Act 2007 means that for the first time, companies and organisations as a corporate entity can be found guilty of corporate manslaughter as a result of serious management failures resulting in a gross breach of a duty of care.

Before the Act came into force on 6th April 2008, a particular individual had to be identified as responsible for the offence. This often was difficult to prove, given that many fatalities result from a combination of circumstances involving a number of people.

The Act clarifies the criminal liabilities of companies including large organisations where a serious failure in the management of health and safety results in a fatality.

Site Waste Management Plans

The Site Waste Management Plans Regulations 2008 came into effect on 6th April 2008 in England. Any company that intends to carry out construction work on any one site, where that project is worth over £300,000 must complete a Site Waste Management Plan (SWMP) before work begins.

The SWMP must be kept on site for the duration of the project, and must be available for two years after completing the project.

In producing the SWMP, companies must consider:

1. Who will be responsible for managing resources on site.
2. What types of waste will be generated.
3. How the waste will be managed (according to the hierarchy Eliminate, Reduce, Reuse, Recycle, Dispose).
4. Which contractors will be appointed to ensure correct disposal.
5. How waste will be handled and segregated on site.
6. Communication of the SWMP and the provision of any relevant training.
7. How the quantities of waste will be measured.
8. The need to evaluate the effectiveness of the SWMP and identifying lessons learnt for application in future projects.

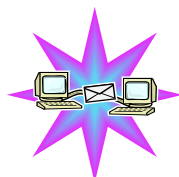
